

SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS BULLETIN

May-June 64

The 1964 South Dakota State Chess Tournament will be held in Pierre S Dak on August 29 and 30th. As in the case of the last meet it will be held in the Community Room of the City Hall, 222 W Dak Ave. These seemed to be very pleasant surroundings last year and also are very handy to the down-town section of Pierre.

Play will begin at 8:30 A.M. on Saturday morning and will feature three rounds Saturday and two Sunday. 40 moves in two hours will be the requirement for players and adjourned games which cannot be finished due to time problems will be adjudicated.

Players are asked to bring their own sets, Staunton type only, boards and clocks, if they have them. It is recommended that sets be at least three inch size. (height of king)

A meeting of all participants will be held at 8:00 Saturday morning for the purpose of familiarization of players with tournament rules and to discuss any problems which might be evident. A players meeting will be held Sunday to elect officers and to discuss all areas pertinent to the SDCA.

Entry Fee of \$5.00 plus USCF membership and SDCA Membership will be required to participate. SDCA dues will be set by players at meeting on Saturday morning, which will also serve as registration time. State dues will include bulletins every month or two. As to content of these bulletins it will have to be discussed at the players meeting.

Prizes will be approximately 50% for 1st, 30% 2nd and 20% for 3rd. At this time it is planned that a trophy will be given to the So Dak player who finishes highest but how this will be financed is not exactly clear yet. It will be done, financed that is, one way or another. It will be noted at this time that the percentages above pertain only to the total amount of money which is available from the \$5.00 fee. The state dues are to be used for bulletin and trophy purposes, ect.

Last year we had sixteen in the tournament and we were missing about three or four who had intended to come but couldn't make it for some reason or another. Let's hope that the dates for this years tournament will be such that we will have our maximum number of people present, which according to present figures would be about 20-25. Lets make this years tourney bigger and better than ever.

People who were here last year are familiar with the accommodations for sleeping and eating. It is not known how many new people will be in but if there is anyone who wants information contact R M Wallace, 1327 1/2 E Dak, Pierre S D.
