

SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS BULLETIN

July-Aug 64

The 1964 South Dakota State Chess Tournament will be held in Pierre S Dak on August 29 and 30th at the Community Room of the City Hall, 222 E. Dakota Ave.

Play will begin at 8:30 A.M. on Saturday morning and will feature three rounds Saturday and two Sunday. Forty Moves in two hours will be the requirement for play and adjourned games which cannot be finished will be adjudicated.

Players are asked to bring their own boards and clocks if available. Bring your own sets if Staunton type and of reasonable size, three inch king size recommended, at minimum.

A meeting of all participants will be held at 8:00 Saturday morning to discuss tournament procedurds. A players meeting will be held Sunday to discuss all areas pertinent to the SDCA and to elect officers for the coming year.

Entry fee of \$5.00 plus USCF membership and SDCA Membership will be required to participate. SDCA dues will be set by players meeting at 8:00 Saturday along with registration formalities, which will be taken care of at that time. Prizes will be approximately 50% 1st, 30%-2nd and 20% for 3rd places. If arrangements are completed by tournament time a trophy will be given to the highest place taken by a South Dakota player along with the title of "1964 State Chess Champion".

Anyone wishing to have sleeping reservations made for them may send the type of accomodtions and price range to R M Wallace, 1327 W Dak, pierre S Dak and some arrangements will be made.
