

TOURNAMENT REPORT

The S Dak State Open Chess Tournament was held at Pierre, 29-30 August at the Community Room of the City Hall, Pierre S Dak. This makes the third consecutive year the tourney has been held in the Capitol City. At present it is again scheduled for Pierre, 28-29 Aug 65.

The tournament was attended by 16 players, same as 1963, not quite as many as expected but a reasonable showing for this area. It is unfortunate that some of last years participants could not attend as it would have made a bigger, richer and more interesting meet all the way round. We should be able to look forward to next years tourney with optimism as it should be, let us say "it will be", the largest S Dak Open in many years. It is hoped that every chess player who receives this bulletin will give a great deal of thought to taking part in the next tournament in Aug of 1965. (See item on coming tournament at Sioux Falls)

We have a new state champion, Charles Keyman, Sioux Falls, who defeated the defending champion, Bryant Holmes, enroute to a $4\frac{1}{2} - \frac{1}{2}$ record. Keyman and Holmes met in round 4 of the 5 round Swiss system tourney, and as it turned out, proved to be the deciding factor. Chuck made quite an improvement over his record at the 1963 Open, a 6th place finish with 2 won, 1 loss and 2 draws.

Finishing in a tie for 2nd and 3rd, Bryant Holmes and Dr Tom Lucas, Broken Bow Nebraska, were all even at 4 - 1. Holmes defeated Lucas in round 3, a big factor in awarding 2nd to Holmes on tie-breakers. Fourth place was taken by M C Furze, Pierre, with a $3\frac{1}{2} - 1\frac{1}{2}$ record, losing to Holmes in round 2 and drawing with Keyman in round 5. Robert Rieman, Minneapolis, finished a clear 5th with a 3-2 record.

A trophy was awarded to Keyman as the S Dak Open and State Champion for 1964 plus a cash prize of \$40.00. Second place was awarded \$20.00 and third \$15.00. Three books, THE CHESS PSYCHOLOGIST, by M. Tahl, former world champion from the U.S.S.R., were awarded to the 9th place finisher, Ben Munson, Donna Rieman and Archie Rieman, Archie made the best showing of the unrated players.

Donna Rieman, Minneapolis, was the only woman participant in the tourney and the first in S Dak Open play for many years. Although Donna didn't have the best of luck in this tourney it has been noted in the Minnesota Chess Journal that she is doing much better since. Robert Rieman, her husband, is also active in the Twin Cities chess picture. We all hope that these fine people will return in the future as we enjoyed having them very much, along with everyone else who was playing.

Missing this year from the Open: Randall Smith, Hebron Neb; John Williams, Sioux City; John Billey, Yankton; Sam Starr, Mitchell; Richard Melton, Sioux Falls; Allan Tommervik, from the 1963 Open. John Billey, I understand, could not attend due to his attendance at school in the east. John is an instructor at the college in Yankton. Tommervik is in the army at present. With a few of these players returning in 1965 along with the regulars and a few new people things should pick up a bit.

On page two you will find the standings. When necessary due to identical scores M. Furze computed the tie breaking points. I believe he used the Solkoff system. Since he isn't in town at present I cannot check on this. Also found on page two is a cross section of what happened round by round, which is rather interesting.
