1965 SIOUX FALLS OPEN TOURNAMENT REPORT

The 1965 Sioux Falls Open was held at the KELO Community Room, Sioux Falls S Dak, 20-21 Mar 65. Due to weather conditions and a conflict with the Class A Basketball Tournament the number of entries was held to nine. Another contributing factor to the low number of players was that CHESS LIFE, who announces the tournaments for the USCF, was about three weeks late in publication and by time it came out it was to late. This is an unusual situation and probably will not occur again.

Discussion at the tournament indicated that there will be another held in 1966 and there is no doubt it will be better attended. It usually takes a couple of years to get a tournament established. I believe that we can all look forward to a bigger and better tourney next year.

Taking 1st place with a record of 4 wins and 1 draw was Robert Wallace of Pierre S D. Charles Keyman placed 2nd with $3\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$, Judson Smalley and Gary Wallace tied for 3rd & 4th with 3-2 each. Due to the odd number of players a bye was necessary in each round, they are indicated on the tournament chart below. It was unfortunate this occurred since it isn't very interesting to sit out a round and also it doesn't always give a good picture of exactly who scored what and how.

R. Wallace drew with Lien in round 1 and finished with wins over Tweedt, Smalley, Holmes and Keyman in that order. Keyman had a bye in Round 1 and finished with a win over Smalley, drew Holmes, won G. Wallace and lost R Wallace in that order. For full details on round by round action see chart.

We welcome two new members to the SDCA, Gordon Tweedt, 2617 W Bailey, and Judson T Smalley, 2616 W 18th St, both of S. Falls. Both participated in the tourney and will be welcome additions to the state open if able to make the trip.

A fine trophy and \$20.00 was awarded to R. Wallace for 1st. Keyman received \$10.00 and \$5.00 was divided between Smalley and G Wallace.

Notes--

(a) Preparing for a(Q)side advance, which however proves too slow. 11. N-K5 followed by P-KB4 is probably essential at this point, freezing blacks QB and KP in most Variations.

(b) Either 14. N-K1 or N-K5 is preferable threatening B-B3, etc.

(c) Of course, with whites forced now congealed on Queen side, this move proves quite strong.

(d) Not 28. BxRP BxRch, QxQ, 30. NxQ, B-K3, 31. N-R7ch.

(e) However, 31. P-KN4 is preferable here, followed by R-KN3, etc.
