SOUTH DAKOTA OPEN

The 1965 South Dakota Open Chess Tournament will be held in Pierre, on August 28 & 29, at the Community Room of the City Hall, 222 E Dakota.

Play will commence at 8:30 A.M. on Saturday morning and will consist of three rounds on that day and two on Sunday. Play will begin at 9:30 AM on Sunday. Rate of play will be forty moves in two hours and twenty per hour thereafter. Adjourned games which are not finished will be adjudicated by the four highest rated players not involved in game.

Players are asked to bring boards and equipment if possible. Sets should be Staunton type and of reasonable size, minimum of three inch king recommended.

A brief meeting of players will be held Saturday morning to discuss tournament rules and procedures. A players meeting will be held Sunday to discuss all areas pertinent to the SDCA and to elect officers for the coming year.

An entry fee of \$5.00 is required for tournament participation. USCF membership is also required, this can be obtained at tournament, and \$2.00 for membership, a prerequisite, in the So Dak Chess Association. Registration will begin at 8:30 Sat morning. Trophy for South Dakota resident finishing highest in tourney, cash prizes to top three finishers. Ninety percent of entry fee will be returned in prizes, 50%-1st, 30%-2nd and 20% to 3rd place. Highest place by S Dak player will be awarded to title of "South Dakota Chess Champion 1965".

Last year and in 1963 sixteen players took part in the S Dak Open. It is hoped that this year a bigger showing comes about with the return of some of the regulars who missed last year and the addition of new blood.

3. There will be one more bulletin prior to the state, probably in late July or early August, with the remainder of the S. Falls Open games. Rounds one, two and three have been published including this bulletin. Round four will be in if time allows.
4. There is a great amount of chess activity in Minnesota. Winner of the 72th Annual Minnesota Championship was Milton Otteson and repeating as womens champion was Donna Rieman. Donna is no stranger to us as you who were in Pierre last August met her and her husband, Robert.

5. The Minnesota Chess Journal has confirmed my fears, the magazine, or booklet as you may wish, CHESSWORLD has apparently gone out of business. Those three copies that my brother and myself, and probably many others, have on the shelf turned out costing us \$3.33 1/3 per copy. Rather costly.
