SOUTH DAKOTA CHESS BULLETIN - 1971 NOVEMBER

The South Dakota 1971 Closed was held at Custer S D on 7-8 August. Directed by Terry D Likens the 15 participants commenced to do battle on the morning of the 7th with Paul Salem, defending champion, the favorite to repeat. In the last, fifth, round Salem and Gary Wallace played to decide the meet, Salem needing only to draw to win his forth straight title. Forty-one moves later the new S D State Champion was Gary Wallace as Paul resigned. Placing 3rd and also the Junior Champ was William Heavlin of Rapid City. Wallace is from Pierre and Salem calls Madison his home. Terry Likens was elected president for the coming year and G. Wallace the Sec-Treasurer. Pierre was selected to be the site of the 1972 S D Closed. The tentative date set for the meet is 24-25 Jun 72.

RANDOM TIDBITS - R Wallace

As I used to do for a couple years when I put out a bulletin in 1963-4 or there-a-bouts a gathering of a few remarks that may or may not be of interest.

As you note only 15 turned out for the SD closed this year, not the turn out expected but a start. Perhaps the more central location of Pierre next year will work out better. Twenty-two of thirty-four entries in the 1970 SD Open at Pierre were from the state.

As most all have heard Bobby won his match with T.P. by sweeping games 6 thru 9 after playing even with one win apiece in games 1 thru 5. Note the large article on RJF in Life magazine, about 12 Nov issue.

Prior to drawing out money for postage and one ream of paper for this publication the account for the SD Chess Association Shows the grand total of \$17.94. It was the practice for many years that all tournaments that were directed under the name of the SD Chapter required players to join the SD Chess Asso. for a fee of \$2.00 per year and this money was put in towards expenses of the association. If the players of this state want any type of organization to exist in S D they best take a good look at the present and set up some guidelines for the future. Reason for no financial report for the last two tournaments, the Rapid City Open and the SD Closed, is simple, there was no statement made by the director. If there is going to be an organization then accurate reports must be made to the Sec-Treasurer. When individuals pay SD dues these must be kept separate from tournament expenses. We must encourage membership, it isn't much to ask that an individual who is interested part with \$2.00 each year to help his chosen organization.
