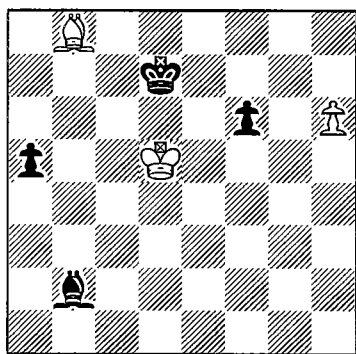
EDITOR'S NOTE

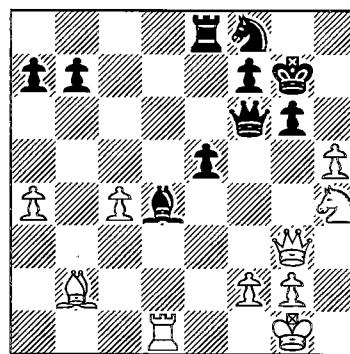
There is also an announcement for the Sioux Falls Open, scheduled for April 22 and 23.

Here are a few chess problems I have seen here and there lately:



WHITE GETS A QUEEN
Hint: Neutralize the bishop.

Solution: 1. Be5! (not 1. h7? f5, etc.) Bxe5 2. h7, etc. Or 1. Be5! fxe5 2. Ke4!, followed by 3. h7 and 4. h8(Q).



WHITE WINS THE BISHOP
Hint: Grab it.

Solution: 1. Rxd4!, etc. If 1. ... exd4, then 2. Bxd4! Qxd4 3. Nf5ch attacking both the king and queen, etc. (Averbach-Penrose 1954).

The South Dakota Closed was held on July 23-24, 1994 in conjunction with the South Dakota Junior Championship. The tournament was one of the largest tournaments held in South Dakota in some time with twenty-seven players. Lyle Hanson had vowed that he would win the state championship and was able to finish undefeated and untied with wins over Sioux Falls Open Champ Samer Adli and State Champ Jeff Barth. Curtis Carroll was victimized by upsets. He lost to Ralph Bailey, drew with Sigurd Rydland and Jack Bier. Jerry Bergan played well with a win over Louis Horton, losing only to Lyle

Hanson and Terry Dean Likens, Sr. David Knudson and Mark Knudson had good results as both finished well ahead of their ratings with two points. Both of the Knudsons beat John Gavin, a 1500 player, enroute to their result. Mark finished his Sunday schedule undefeated after winning the State Junior Championship in a playoff on Saturday, July 23, 1994. Other upsets included Alan Kingsley's draw with Pat Steele, David Johnson's win over John Gavin, Eric Hosen's draw with Bruce Brandt and Steve Schaffer's draw with Jeff Barth.

The SDCA held its first separate junior championship. We had five players in attendance with three from Artesian-Letcher. David Everhard and Mark Knudson tied for first with three points in the round robin format. Mark won a two game playoff with David. My thanks to Jeff Barth for organizing the tournament and providing the playing site at the Labor Temple and to Terry Dean Likens, Sr. for his assistance in directing the Junior while I was doing registration on the Closed.

Many games were over in less than an hour. Several Scholastic games could have gone either way. It was exciting to walk by the tables and follow the games.

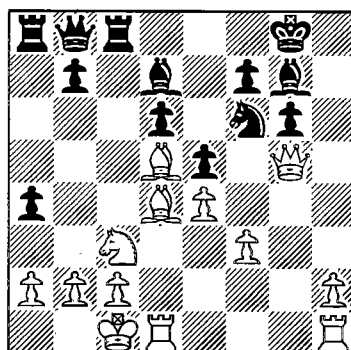
This years Master Challenge was very tough. Some entries were close. We went with Samer Adli for the championship. His lines followed R-h8 and he received the nod
