We have a very good winter for chess in South Dakota – despite the blizzard of 1997. The Scholastic scene was very active. Flandreau Indian School held its second annual tournament which attracted 31 players. The South Dakota Scholastic Championships – played on March 22, 1997 at Sioux Falls O'Gorman High School in Sioux Falls – attracted 79 players. This number was double last years turnout.

Pierre Indian Learning Center chess students had the opportunity to attend the *Scholastic Super Nationals* in Knoxville, Tennessee from April 25 to April 27, 1997. Russel Bordeaux competed in the primary section. Jesse Westover, Everett (Jimmy) Eastman, Andrew Ramsey and South Dakota Elementary Champion Josiah Himes competed in the Elementary Section. Jesse Estes and Jeremiah (Tony) Blackbear competed in the Junior High Section. The students had a wonderful experience and even managed to do a little sight-seeing. According to Annie Henry – a PILC Chess Club advisor – "It was awesome."

The SDCA has three events upcoming this summer. The Western South Dakota Open will be held in Rapid City on May 17-18, 1997. The South Dakota Teams will be held in Oacoma (Chamberlain / A's Oasis) on June 21-22, 1997. An entry form has been inserted for your use. The SDCA meeting will be held on Sunday June 22, 1997. This is your official notice of that meeting. One issue that has come up is how much we should be charging scholastics, whether we should be charging them a membership fee at the scholastic and whether we should be sending them a bulletin that includes scholastic results. The South Dakota Closed will be held in Pierre on July 19-20, 1997 at the Pierre Chamber of Commerce. The South Dakota Junior will be held as a separate event in connection with the Closed.

The *Sioux Empire Chess Foundation* and the *South Dakota Tourism Department* will present the Governor's Cup on September 12-14, 1997 in Sioux Falls. The tournament will be held at the new *Sioux Falls Convention Center*. This event features \$8000.00 in prizes, a speed chess tournament and a simultaneous exhibition by a grandmaster. A scholastic event will be held in connection with this tournament. Plan to attend now. The organizers are giving reduced entry fees to persons who enter early and in groups of four or more so enter early.

In addition to the SDCA events we will be holding a Joe House tournament in August in Brookings. Ralph Bailey will be holding a tournament in July and his Spiel Der Krafte at the end of September. The tournament schedule ends in October with the Coyote Classic in Vermillion and a tournament in Rapid City.

This modified edition of the bulletin is being sent out to the players from the 1997 Scholastic Chess Championship. We would like to thank the *Sioux Empire Chess Foundation* for sponsoring the mailing of this bulletin. We hope to encourage the players to participate in upcoming events throughout the year. FLANDREAU INDIAN SCHOOL SCHOLASTIC

The Flandreau Indian School sponsored its second annual scholastic chess tournament on March 8, 1997. Thirty one players from six different schools attended. The host – Flandreau Indian School – entered eight players including seven in the high school section. Pierre Indian Learning Center brought eleven players. Flandreau Indian School won the High School Team Championship with score of ten beating Madison which scored seven points with only three players. Michael Bergan of Madison won the High School Championship.

Pierre Indian Learning Center won the Junior High Division with eight points while Madison Middle School and Sioux Falls Whittier Middle School tied for second place with seven points. Mark Ditmanson of Sioux Falls Whittier Middle School won the Junior High School Individual title.

There were sufficient players to hold an elementary school division. Pierre Indian Learning Center won the Elementary School Division with nine points. Sioux Falls Edison Middle School finished second with five points followed by Madison Elementary with four points. John Bergan of Madison won the Elementary School Division for the second consecutive year.

Flandreau Indian School was pleased with this event and hopes to have one again next year as a preparation and a fund raiser for its participation in the South Dakota Scholastic.

South Dakota Scholastic

The South Dakota Scholastic was held on March 22, 1997 at Sioux Falls O'Gorman High School. The site was excellent and was big enough to hold the large number of players attending this years tournament. Seventy-nine players attended this years' tournament. This number is double the number attending last years' tournament and makes it the largest scholastic tournament ever held in South Dakota.

We must thank the scholastic organizers at the school level: Barry Thompson at Flandreau Indian School, Glenn Eide and Annie Henry at Pierre Indian Learning Center, Sam Oddie, Jr. at Sioux Falls – O'Gorman High School, Jean Rasmussen at Howard, Dr. Sandra Odegaard at Sioux Falls – Patrick Henry, Michelle Loeske at Sioux Falls – John Harris, Elizabeth Crump at All City Elementary, Erik Uecker at Sioux Falls – Washington, and Phyllis Schrag at Sioux Falls – Lincoln.

Four of the Whittier players attended the Chess Clinic presented *Sioux Empire Chess Foundation*. De Knudson of the *Sioux Empire Chess Foundation* deserves a big thanks. She not only organized the Chess Clinic, but assisted with the organization of the chess clubs at All City Elementary, Patrick Henry and John Harris as well as telling the people at Pierre Indian Learning Center whom to contact regarding chess. The *Sioux Empire Chess Foundation* also donated thirteen sets and boards to the Madison chess club and Flandreau Indian School Chess Clubs.

We must thank the following chess players who gave their time to assist chess: David Kerkhove at All City Elementary and Patrick Henry Middle School in Sioux Falls; John Wathier at Lincoln High School; Bob Wallace at Pierre Indian Learning Center, John Daucsavage at Edison Middle School; Jud Bergen at the Madison schools and Osman Palos at John Harris Elementary.

Flandreau Indian School won its fourth consecutive State High School Chess Championship by a wider margin than last year. They finished with 12 points. All four of its team members had three points. Sioux Falls O'Gorman finished in second place with 10 points. Sioux Falls Lincoln finished in third place with eight points.

TJ Likens of Rapid City Central High School won the individual championship of the State High School Championship with four points. The winner of the High School Division qualifies to play in the Arnold Denker Tournament for High School Champions sponsored by the *United States Chess Federation*. This tournament will be held August 11-15, 1997 in Orlando, Florida.

David Likens of Rapid City South Middle School and Ryan Daggitt of Sioux Falls Memorial Middle School tied for the Junior High School Division with a perfect score. Sioux Falls Patrick Henry Middle School edged out Sioux Falls Whittier Middle School 11-10.5 to win the Junior High Division. The Junior High team championship was decided on board one when David Likens beat Federico Rameriez of Whittier with the entire Patrick Henry standing around the board rooting for David Likens to win. He did and they won the championship by one-half point over Whittier.

Josiah Himes of Pierre Indian Learning Center won the Elementary School Division. Pierre Indian Learning Center also won the Elementary School Division when Josiah Himes of the Pierre Indian Learning Center beat Wesley Daucsavage of Sioux Falls Edison Middle School in the last round. Pierre Indian Learning Center beat Sioux Falls Edison by the score of 12-11 so the last round game on the top board was decisive.

The South Dakota State Scholastic Chess Tournament is sponsored by the *South Dakota Chess Association*. Pierre Indian Learning Center brought sixteen players. Nine players from the host – Sioux Falls O'Gorman – played. Flandreau Indian School brought seven kids. Seven players from both Sioux Falls Patrick Henry and Sioux Falls Whittier Middle Schools played in the tournament. Sioux Falls Lincoln High School sent five players and five players from Madison schools attended. Sioux Falls finally justified the switch of the site to Sioux Falls with a turnout of forty-six players.

My thanks to all the participants and organizers. Thanks to Terry and Jill Likens assisted with the tournament and my wife, Susan Schmidt who assisted with registrations. Lastly, the biggest thanks should go to Sam Ogdie who obtained the site at the Sioux Falls O'Gorman cafeteria and had it ready for the horde which arrived on Saturday morning. John Daucsavage donated a Chess Master which donated by the South Dakota Chess Association to Sioux Falls O'Gorman for their part in assisting us with the tournament. The turnout exceeded our wildest imagination. We were hoping for fifty players. Next year hopefully we can break one hundred players.

The South Dakota Junior Championship will be played as separate closed championship on July 27, 1996 in Pierre. The Governors Cup will have a scholastic division.

I have included the last round games from all of the 1st Place individuals because of the decisive nature of these games.
