Another season of SDCA events is complete and we can look forward to fall and the end of the 1997 chess year. Five players played in all four SDCA events: Alan Kingsley and Sigurd Rydland of Pierre and Terry, TJ and David Likens of Rapid City.

In May, Jack Bier won the **Western South Dakota Open** against a field of 13 players.

Six teams played in the **South Dakota Team Championship** at Al's Oasis in June. Pierre won the Teams again. Reuben Bezpaletz won third board prize to lead Pierre to the title. The Gross Masters -- a team made up of Brookings and Sioux Falls players -- finished second led by Bruce Brandt -- second board prize winner -- and Wilbur Marsh who won the fourth board prize with a hard fought victory over Mark Knudson. Terry Likens of the Likens team took the top board prize.

The **South Dakota Closed** featured a larger turnout than we saw at either Sioux Falls or Rapid City proving that Pierre still has viability as site for a chess tournament. Curtis Carroll won a four person playoff for the title of State Champion. Mark Knudson won the Junior Division and is State Junior Champion.

My congratulations to **De Knudson** who is our new president and **Jud Bergan** who is our new vice-president. A big thanks to Curtis Carroll, outgoing president who is moving to Oregon in October. It is nice to have new blood in the organization. I have seen De's chess work over the last year on behalf of the **Sioux Empire Chess Foundation**. It is largely through her organization that chess has been revived in the Sioux Falls public schools and brought the largest chess tournament ever seen in South Dakota to Sioux Falls. Many volunteers have gone to the schools this year, but the initial contacts to open the school to chess were made through De. Because of De's efforts, Sioux Falls was named one of the chess cities of the year. Sioux Falls Mayor Gary Hanson has been invited to go to Orlando to receive this honor along with De.

I saw Jud Bergan at work when he and De organized the **Sioux Falls-Madison scholastic match** on May 31. He has been running a very successful ladder tournament at his club and brought a very enthusiastic and talented group which nearly beat the best that Sioux Falls had to offer.

The **Sioux Empire Chess Foundation** and the **Tourism Department** will present the **Governor's Cup** on September 12-14, 1997 in Sioux Falls. The tournament will be held at the new Sioux Falls Convention Center. This event features \$8000.00 in prizes, speed chess tournament and a simultaneous exhibition by a grandmaster. A scholastic event will be held in connection with this tournament. A flyer is included in this issue of bulletin. Plan to attend now.

We will be holding a **Joe House** tournament in August in Brookings. Ralph Bailey will be holding a his **Spiel Der Krafte** at the end of September. The tournament schedule ends in October with the **Coyote Classic** in Vermillion and a tournament in **Rapid City**.

On a personal note, thank you for the cards and condolences sent to me on the death of my father.

It is nice to know that your chess family is there for you. My thanks to the contributors to this issue: De Knudson, Ralph Bailey, Curtis Carroll, Jud Bergan, Terry, Jill, David and TJ Likens. WS

PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

Thank you for giving me an opportunity to serve as your president. I didn't realize that my chess game had improved that much since I met all of you five years ago! Thank you for welcoming us into the SD chess family as you have. On behalf of all our members, I would like to thank Curtis Carroll for serving as our president these past two years. It will be difficult to follow him, especially since his chess games is considerably better than mine! He will continue to advise me and help me when needed.

It has been an exciting year in SD as far as chess goes. The first annual **Governor's Cup Chess Tournament** was more successful than we ever imagined, and the scholastic chess program has made great strides.

Annie Henry of Pierre organized a chess club at the **Pierre Indian Learning Center** and even took some players to Tennessee in April for the Super Nationals. If we could only clone her, my job would be very easy!

Jud Bergan from **Madison** started a wonderful chess club there and organized the first Sioux Falls vs. Madison match which was held in late May. He is now working on organizing a **scholastic league** in SD. I hope that Annie and Jud will inspire a chess spark in your community. Remember that the **Sioux Empire Chess Foundation** can provide schools or agencies with vinyl boards, sets, scoresheets, clocks and instructional materials.

Another superstar chess volunteer is Michelle Loseke from Sioux Falls. She coordinates the weekly chess club at **John Harris Elementary School** here in **Sioux Falls** and also has helped with the weekly summer chess club at the **Ronning Branch Library**. That club meets every Friday from 2 - 4pm. and will meet through August 22. Thanks again, Michelle, for all you do to promote scholastic chess.

Because of the Governor's Cup, the United States Chess Federation has recently named Sioux Falls as one of two chess cities of the year. Knoxville, Tennessee -- site of the Super Nationals -- was the other city chosen to win this award.

Boards for the **simultaneous exhibition** against a well-known grandmaster on Thursday, September 11, at the Empire Mall in Sioux Falls are now for sale at \$30. Two boards have been sold at this point, and I expect them to sell quickly. That exhibition will start promptly at 5 p.m. Checks should be made out to **Sioux Empire Chess Foundation** and sent to me at 2100 Slaten Court, Sioux Falls, South Dakota 57103. Also please send in your entry fee to the **Governor's Cup** as soon as possible. The entry fee is \$35 now but increases to \$55 if postmarked after September 6.

On a personal note, we would like to share our condolences with Wes Schmidt and his family on

the death of Wes' father and wish **Jack Bier and Kari Rivers** many years of happiness together.

The *Sioux Empire Chess Foundation* will bring **Loren Schmidt -- Senior Master and FIDE Master** -- to Sioux Falls on August 14 and 15 to give an adult clinic and scholastic clinic. Loren Schmidt is a Life Master who was originally from Nebraska and now resides in Yakima, Washington. Loren has played in several chess Olympiads and Asian Zonal Tournaments as first board for the Japanese team.

Living in (Ratings) Deflationary Times

We all play chess for a lot of different reasons. I like to think I play in part because it offers an abstract discipline in which one can focus one's mind, and that irrespective of the medium, the focus itself is valuable, even precious. That is not to say that I don't feel the same elation and dejection as most player over wins and losses -- I do. But I don't believe that I would continue to play if chess offered only the zero sum rewards of that dimension of the competition -- and were that so I would be playing in a lower section of the upcoming Governor's Cup instead of the Open.

Still, does hurt to lose, and it hurts to drop relatively in the ratings and apparent strength. If ego were our reason for playing, however, most of us would have given up the game long ago, and we would quitting droves right now. As Bill Goichburg noted, unless special measures are taken, the

rating system is naturally deflationary. New players start, establish ratings at relatively low levels, and then they improve -- increasing their own ratings and bringing everyone else down. Anyone that doubts that this is happening in large measure need only examine the pre and post tournament rating projections from the South Dakota Closed Championship.

Five juniors with previously established ratings played. All five finished with substantially higher rating than when they started. There were also three unrated players, and the other twenty of us had to absorb the loss in aggregate. Something similar happened at the Teams Championship. I do not believe that this is because South Dakota chess players are getting weaker. To the contrary, it is because our young players -- each and every one of them are getting stronger. That is -- after years of bemoaning the relative lack of "new blood" in South Dakota chess -- far more of a blessing than a curse.

Congratulations to all of them -- and especially to Mark Knudson on winning a South Dakota Junior Championship that means more than the ratings would indicate.

This year's turnout for the Closed was good with 28 players. The junior section had a good turnout with six out of eight also competing in the Closed beginning in the third round. Out of those six, three won prizes .

First round there were two upsets with David Knudson winning against Audie Brockel and Jill Likens drawing Gary Wallace. Alan Kingsley had a forced win against Marty LaRoche, but he did not find it -- much to Marty's relief.

Second round upsets included Jud Bergan's win against Jeff Barth and Audie Brockel's draw with Gary Wallace. Terry Likens drew with James Janke, but was lucky to get the draw -- after Janke made two bad moves in a row to allow the draw.

Third round the players from the junior section joined and more upsets ensued. T.J.Likens won against Jerry Bergan, while brother David drew with Arlo Mann in an interesting game (pawn on seventh with rook behind and Arlo's in front of pawn). Lyle Hanson was moving along to a fourth round confrontation with Curtis Carroll.

Fourth round saw T.J.Likens playing his fourth Bergan (Jud) and winning -- placing him in a tie for second. Lyle Hanson moved into clear first with a win over Curtis Carroll. Jeff Barth held Terry Likens to a draw. John Bergan defeated Alan Kingsley, while brother David Bergan defeated Larry Cass.

Fifth round began with Lyle Hanson in first with six players one point behind -- Curtis Carroll, Martin LaRoche, Robert Wallace, and Terry, TJ and Jill Likens. Lyle offered Terry Likens a draw after move one, but Likens had white and declined as white has won all meetings between the two with the exception of one draw. Terry won allowing a four way tie with Martin LaRoche and Curtis Carroll. Gary Wallace lost a tough end game to Mark Knudson giving Mark a tie for D money. James Janke defeated Audie Brockel to win Class B Money (note USCF had an incorrect rating of 1200\5 for James Janke, but it has been corrected)

MADISON AND SIOUX FALLS DRAW IN DUAL CHESS MATCH

In a fiercely contested match that wasn't settled until the last game of the last round, Sioux Falls and Madison battled to a dead heat at the Ronning Branch Library in Sioux Falls Saturday. Twelve

Madison chessplayers traveled to Sioux Falls representing their schools in three divisions: Elementary -- K-6; Jr.High -- 7-9; and Sr.High -- 10-12. Each division had four players who competed against each of the four players in that division from the other city -- one per round for

four rounds.

In the elementary section, Madison gained a solid victory, scoring 12 1/2 points to 3 1/2 points for Sioux Falls. Sixteen total games were played in each section, with each win worth 1 point and each draw worth 1/2 point. John Bergan of Madison was the individual Elementary champion with a perfect 4-0 record.

In the Jr.High section, the two teams battled to an 8-8 draw, going 2-2 in each round. Individual honors went to Federico Ramirez of Sioux Falls -- also with four wins and no losses for the day.

The Sr.High contest produced the kind of excitement that sends the cardiac generation scurrying for their nitroglycerin pills. Madison took the early lead in the first round two wins and a draw against one win and a draw for Sioux Falls. They hung on to this lead until the fourth round, where they won the first, but lost the second and third games of the round. This left Mark Knudson of Sioux Falls and Michael Bergan of Madison -- each with three wins and no losses up to that point -- engaged in the match-deciding game for the High School section. Knudson won an early pawn and then exchanged a bishop and knight for another pawn and a rook. The two played even from then on until Bergan managed to win back two pawns with only five minutes left to play on each other's clock. At this point it looked like Bergan had the win for himself and his team, when Knudson sacrificed his rook in a sharp maneuver that allowed him to queen a pawn and go on to win the game, the Sr.High section, and individual honors with a 4-0 record.

A crowd of twenty-five spectators broke into spontaneous applause in appreciation for the high caliber of play. A rematch is planned for August of this year. Jud Bergan matched the \$200 contribution. Wes Schmidt announced that the Bulletin deadlines will be Aug. 1, March 1, May 1, and Dec. 1 (and obviously the bulletin will be published quarterly).
