Chess Clinic

The Sioux Empire Chess Foundation sponsored two chess clinics on August 14th and 15th featuring instruction by Senior Master and FIDE Master, Dr. Loren Schmidt of Yakima, Washington. Dr. Schmidt has sent us a report on the clinic. " At the 1997 Sioux Falls Chess Clinic, we spent an evening working with

players of all ages followed by a day-long session with scholastic players. In the evening, a vocal crowd of more than 25 discussed the element of POSITION: the role of pawn structure in short and long-range planning. Looking at some master games, we saw how the pawn structure helps us decide the best squares for our pieces, how it determines where and how we can attack, and how to make use of weak squares and weak pawns in the opponents position. We also spent some time analyzing particular openings and seeing how the element of position figures into our opening strategy.

The scholastic clinic the following day had nearly 20 players participating. Using materials from the Heritage College Chess Clinic held annually in Washington, players explored a number of topics, vying for prizes donated by McDonald's and Burger King for excellent answers, good results, and staunch perseverance. Naturally, we reviewed chess notation- and essential part of any chess player's education because you can't learn from your mistakes if you don't know what they were! To review the endgame, they took part in a Pawn Wars tournament, where the pawns duke it out using only their pawns, trying to be the first one to make a Queen and win the game. That not only emphasizes the importance of the pawns but also helps students understand the stalemate and en passant rules because they occur so frequently. We also went back to the opening to think about the role of TIME in chess- not time on the clock, but from the quick development of pieces. Teams of players competed in the "Time Quiz Bowl," trying to find the best move to save time-or avoid losing time!-in a number of opening positions. Then we finished the day with a simultaneous exhibition by Dr. Loren R. Schmidt. Loren managed to win them all in the end, but many players put up good resistance and deservedly earned more fast food rewards! " - Dr. Loren Schmidt, FIDE Master and USCF Senior Master.

The first Joe House August Classic was held on August 16-17,1997 in the basement of Max Fjelstad's establishment in Brookings. Despite the warm weather only fifteen players showed up. We have held two tournaments here in February under terrible conditions and had over twenty players. We had three players from North Dakota and one from Sioux City. Three players came from Madison and three from the Brookings area. Sioux Falls provided only two players. The first round featured a win by David Bergan rated 1117 over Arman Goplen, a 1627 rated player from North Dakota. Bergan was down material, but was able to queen his passed pawn while his opponents pawns were stopped. The second round featured an exciting draw between Rick Case and Arlo Mann. Rick appeared to be winning until he dropped his bishop. Then Arlo appeared to have a win until he dropped his last pawn leaving a king versus a king and a knight. Arlo ended up winning the C prize.

David Bergan got a great attack out of a Kings Gambit against Bruce Brandt and appeared to have a win until he lost his rook to a fork. Rick Case is probably tired of the Bergans. He lost to Jud Bergan in round three and David Bergan in round four. David Bergan won the D and Below prize with his wins over Case and Goplen. Jack Bier and Arman Goplen played the Swiss Gambit to perfection ending with four and three and one-half points respectively after scoring no points in the first round. Arman had to beat Greg Sanford, an 1800 rated player from Sioux City and draw with master and JoeHouse winner, Mike Sailer to win the B prize. Jack beat Bruce Brandt and David Bergan on his way an undefeated record and second place in the tournament. Mike Sailer won the tournament, drawing only with Arman Goplen in the last round. Tournament conditions were less than ideal. The air conditioning broke down so the employees left the doors open. As a result we had an enormous number of flies. Alan Kingsley was our official fly killer. Our thanks to the JoeHouse and Max Fjelstad who we hope will have us back for the Joe House Coffee Classic in February.

MADISON CHESS CHAMPS

Madison emerged as the undisputed champions in a dynamite chess duel with Sioux Falls. The local chess juggernaut swept all three divisions-- elementary, junior high, and high school, with an overall record of 32 ½ - 15 ½, where a win is worth 1 point and a draw is worth ½ point. Each division consisted of four players who competed for four rounds at the Karl Mundt Foundation.

In the elementary section two of Madison's representatives Jeremy Bahmuller and John Bergan, steamrolled their Sioux Falls opponents with perfect scores. The elementary players tallied a 13-3 to win this trophy with Bahmuller and Bergan's names engraved as the individual co-champs.

Andrew Ellsworth, who missed the first round due to scheduling complications, won the last three rounds to take individual honors in the junior high section. Steve Cahill went 3-1 for the visitors losing only to Ellsworth. Overall, Madison took the trophy with a 10-6 record.

The fiercest contest was in the senior high division, where Madison was hoping to avenge a 7 ½ -8 ½ loss from last spring. In the first round, Madison won three out of four, losing only to South Dakota Scholastic State Champ, Mark Knudson. In the next round, anticipating an easy time of it, Madison was stunned by two upset Sioux Falls victories, including a startling win by Casey Swanson over Madison's top board, Mike Bergan, and another win by Knudson. This evened the match at 4-4. The third round provided all the excitement of triple overtime basketball, as David (Bergan) clashed with the chess Goliath (Knudson). Bergan gained an early positional advantage and cashed it in by forcing Knudson to give up his queen for a rook. With this large material lead and also well ahead on time, it looked as if Bergan could coast to an easy win. However, Knudson down is not Knudson out, and through quick, accurate play, he evened the game materially and reduced Bergan's time advantage from 15 minutes to only three minutes. In the lightning chess that followed, Knudson pulled ahead a rook and a knight, but couldn't convert it to a win as his time ran out and Bergan claimed the victory with only two minutes remaining on his own clock and a very numb brain. His team mates added two more wins and a draw. In the fourth and last round, Sioux Falls need all four wins to save the match, but it was not to be, as first Bergan then Tony Amert (2-1) and Mathew Havlik (3-1) picked off their opponents for a decisive 10 ½ -5 ½ team victory. Knudson edged Mike Bergan in the last round to lead the challengers with a 3-1 score. David Bergan took individual high school honors with a 4-0 record.

At this time I am uncertain where I officially ended up in that group after the tie breaks were calculated. This is my highest finish in any national scholastic tournament
