

FLANDREAU INDIAN SCHOOL SEEKS 5TH HS TITLE

March is the big season for scholastic chess in South Dakota main events. There will be scholastic events held in Sioux Falls, Flandreau and Madison prior to the state scholastic chess tournament on March 28. I will be directing three tournaments in three weeks in March. Fortunately, I will have Jud Bergan to assist me in Madison and Terry and Jill Likens to assist me at the State Scholastic.

We need more tournament directors in this state. Mark Derby of Vermillion will be directing tournaments at USD. Jud Bergan runs the Madison club, which has the largest and most active membership in the state and will be running one of the largest money tournaments in South Dakota history. Alan Kingsley will be running a tournament in Pierre in October. Reuben Bezpaletz runs tournaments for the Pierre Club. Terry Likens, our sole Senior Tournament Director, runs the Rapid City Chess Club and directs three of four of the SDCA events. Ralph Bailey runs 3 unique events in Sioux Falls and now has his own chess club. We need 18 directors to assist in 1999 National High School. If you have any interest in helping, call De Knudson.

It is fun and a little unnerving to see the enthusiasm for chess among the scholastic players. We used to complain that no one came to the State Scholastic from Sioux Falls. It could be that we never asked them or encouraged clubs to grow. Since De Knudson and the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation took on this task, we have seen clubs grow at two junior highs, four elementary schools, the home school association and the children's home society. Kids, Inc. has offered us the opportunity to teach chess in after-school programs at four additional elementary schools. Edison Middle School and Patrick Henry Middle School in Sioux Falls recently held a match of 14 boards in which 31 players played. The Pierre Indian Learning Center with assistance from Bob Wallace plans to send 32 players to the Flandreau tournament. Last year 25 persons showed up for our clinic and 28 played in the Winter Match Play Tournament. This year 60 persons showed up for the clinic and 52 players played in the Winter Match Play. Flandreau Indian School is looking forward to the opportunity to win its 5th consecutive State Scholastic Championship. We now have 6 juniors rated over 1300 whereas last none were rated at level. Michael Bergan and Mark Knudson have played 5 times over the last years with Michael winning twice and Mark winning three times. Lastly, I have finally learned how to use Word Perfect tables and use Winboard game editing program. These should make the game scores accurate and the cross tables straight. We urge to look at SDCA website archives site. Mark now has past SD team, individual and scholastic champions posted. We are still awaiting our first anecdote. Our president De Knudson has named Gary and Bob Wallace as our SDCA archivists.

PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Chess opportunities continue to multiply in South Dakota. I hope you marked all the upcoming dates on your calendar. When possible, please register in advance. Sixty people attended the all day clinic on January 17 at the downtown library in Sioux Falls. The clinic was sponsored by the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation. Wes Schmidt, Mark Knudson, Steve Haataja, David Kerkhove and Jack Bier served as chess instructor, and Steve Haataja and Paul Salem played simultaneous exhibitions with many of the participants. It was wonderful to have so many new chess players attend this event. Besides several home schoolers and children from the Sioux Falls Children's Home Society, people from Vermillion, Aberdeen, Lower Brule, Estelline, and Chamberlain joined the many Sioux Falls players. The next day, January 18, fifty-two chess players

competed in Ralph Bailey's annual Winter Match Play Tournament. Results of this tournament are found elsewhere in the newsletter. Thanks, Ralph and Wes, for all your work organizing and promoting the clinic and tournament.

Two weeks later on February 1, Mark Derby hosted the Marcel Duchamp Pro Bowl at the

University of South Dakota in Vermillion. Wes Schmidt directed. Steve Norquist won the Tournament without having to answer any questions about Duchamp's life! Derby had threatened to quiz the participants on Duchamp if any ties removed.

The third Joe House Coffee Classic was moved to the Student Union at South Dakota State University on February 7-8. Mike Sailer from North Dakota placed first, and his fellow North Dakotan, Rick Case, tied for second with "my" Mark Knudson, a ninth grader, from Sioux Falls.

Once again, Wes Schmidt served as the tournament director.

Many more chess events are scheduled for March and April, including Jud Bergan's first

Dakota Open on March 21-22. I may even play in that event!

New chess clubs have been established at the Children's Home Society, Robert Frost

Elementary School, East Dakota Cooperative, Hayward Elementary School in Sioux Falls.

Also, the Patrick Henry Middle School's Rampaging Rooks have resumed weekly play thanks to the efforts of Sandy Leonard, a Patrick Henry teacher and Wes Schmidt.

I am predicting a huge turnout at the State Scholastic Tournament on March 28 at O'Gorman High School in Sioux Falls. Eighty students competed last year. I am hoping for 120 players this year! It will be extremely helpful to the directors if chess coaches give Wes Schmidt advance notice on how many players are attending from each school and pre-register them.

3RD JOE HOUSE COFFEE CLASSIC

It was a strange experience starting this 3rd JoeHouse Coffee Classic. The tournament had to be held at SDSU because the JoeHouse has closed in January and is presently for sale. Bruce Brandt was able to obtain a room in the SDSU Student Union as a tournament site. Max Fjelstad had previously guaranteed the prize fund. Since his place was closed I had to stand the guarantee. Fortunately, twenty players showed up which was sufficient to cover the guarantee. The 1st round produced some interesting results. Ron McNamara forced Steve Norquist to offer him a draw with his variation of the Colle. Michael Bergan won Lyle Hanson's queen and won in a few more moves. Robert Feldstein arrived from Brooklyn approximately 100 minutes late for the first round. Jerry Bergan decided not to accept a time forfeit and wanted to play him instead. Feldstein had only 10 minutes on his clock to make 40 moves. He was able to make the time control with less than five seconds on clock. He entered the sudden death time control after saccing his rook. In the sudden death, he and Jerry combined to force a triple repetition. The second round produced another Bergan upset. This time it was John Bergan beating Wilbur Marsh. Wilbur was done a rook after the opening. He was able to get back his material, but lost a rook to an excellent maneuver by John which won the game. In round 3 Rick Case was able to queen first against Feldstein and win Feldstein's queen and the game. Jud Bergan and

Ron McNamara played an exciting game, attacking on the same side as their kings. Jud seemed to be on top, but his kingside was so weak that the tables turned. Unfortunately, for Ron he missed a chance to enter the second control a piece up and allowed Jud to achieve a position with opposite colored bishops and no insufficient losing chances. Kari Rivers beat Wilbur Marsh to continue her good results in the last three tournaments.. On Sunday morning, Mike Sailer was able to beat Rick Case rather quickly leaving him a full point ahead, because Lyle Hanson and Steve Norquist had drawn. Mark Knudson won another game in his rivalry with Michael Bergan. These two have played five times in the last year. In the last round, Mike Sailer drew with Steve Norquist to take clear first in the tournament. Mark Knudson won a rook v. two pawn endgame over to beat Robert Feldstein and tie for second with Rick Case who beat Bruce Brandt in the last round. Bruce Brandt won the B prize with 3 points. Jud Bergan was awarded the C prize with 3 points because Mark Knudson shared 2nd and 3rd place. Dennis Amerine took the D prize with 2.5 points. Eugene Beckwith won the E and below prize with 2 points. People seemed to like this location better than the JoeHouse. Maybe the Brookings people will sponsor another tournament in the future. Robert Feldstein displayed his plaque showing all of the players he played in his county seat tour which will be featured in Chess Life next month. He is starting a new tour and played many players rated games between rounds. Thanks to Bruce Brandt for arranging the tournament site at the last minute without which the tournament would not have possible.
