SCHOLASTIC CHESS BOOM CONTINUES

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After a record setting scholastic season in South Dakota, we prepare for the SDCA calendar. We are issuing our second Scholastic edition to those who attended scholastic tournaments in March in South Dakota. We owe much of the resurgence of chess in South Dakota to scholastic chess. In 1993 we had no scholastic. The number of South Dakota listed on the 1993 annual rating list was only 52. When we revived the scholastic, the number of persons listed on the rating list from South Dakota went up to 73 in 1994, 99 in 1995, 119 in 1996 and 277 in 1997. De reports that the number of South Dakota members is now 337. This number is more than the number of players in North Dakota, Wyoming, and Montana combined together. We still have a very narrow base. Nearly ten percent of these players are from Pierre Indian Learning Center.

The high school division expansion has been slow. The largest portion of expansion is the elementary division. Two years ago we had only one player in the elementary division. This year we had 66. Next year we will split the K-3 division from the elementary. We may also split the high school division to a different day.

Two years ago there were no players from Madison or Pierre Indian Learning Center. Last year there were no

players from Sioux Falls Home School Association. Yet Madison and Sioux Falls Home School Association won the three divisions and Pierre Indian Learning Center finished second in the both junior high and elementary divisions.

Sometimes we can tell what causes players to enter the tournament. It was Jack Bier and Steve Haataja teaching at Robert Frost and Hayward that brought these players to play at state. Yet some of the schools where chess was taught last year had no more players entered than last year and in some cases fewer persons entered.

So far this year in tournaments where scholastics were included growth has been explosive. Winter Match Play:52;Dakota Open,58;Flandreau Indian Chess Club Scholastic,53; South Dakota State Scholastic,136.

We hope that this growth will translate into increased number of players in future years. We certainly could use this injection of new blood. In tournaments where no scholastic was offered only 15 showed up for the Duchamp 20 at the JoeHouse and 26 at the Sioux Falls Open.

But even here the scholastics shown through. Mark Knudson finished second at the JoeHouse beating expert Robert Feldstein for the second time. In the last year Mark has beaten four experts(Steve Norquist, Robert Feldstein(twice and David Kerkhove.)Yet,Mark is even in his series with Michael Bergan at 3-3. The Likens showed how competitive scholastic chess has become by finishing 1-2 at state ahead of both Mark and Michael.

Curtis Carroll pointed out after the South Dakota Closed that the young players were improving at our expense,but this is necessary to the future success of chess in South Dakota no matter how painful it may be to us. Although it may appear that chess is exploding, we have not scratched the surface. We are still only bringing in players from three of the eight middle schools in Sioux Falls and only ten of the thirty-six elementary schools. We are still lacking an organized chess club at Sioux Falls Washington.

In Sioux Falls, De has organized our scholastic chess clubs and Jack Bier, Steve Haataja, David Kerkhove, John Wathier, Wes Schmidt, Mark Knudson, Steve Cahill, and Ryan Daggitt

have assisted with these clubs. In Madison, Jud Bergan has established a chess club which is the envy of all clubs in the state. His teams took two state titles and finished third in elementary. The Estelline players had never played until their appearance at Flandreau. They brought nine players to the State Scholastic. Pierre Indian Learning Center brought twenty-nineplayers and yet many of their players were at wrestling tournaments. Many of the Robert Frost players were at a asketball tournament.

South Dakota scholastic chess has had a successful year so far. We invite you to play in the SDCA events listed in this bulletin. The Sioux Empire Chess Club will offer weekly scholastic tournaments on Fridays at the Ronning Library in Sioux Falls from 1-5 pm from June 5 to August 14. Jack Bier will offer an analysis group. If scholastic players, coaches, organizers or parents need any help from us, we will be glad to help.

Chess continues to flourish in South Dakota! As of March 31, 337 South Dakotans were members of the United States Chess Federation. Please note all of the wonderful spring and summer chess opportunities that are available to your and jot each one of them on your calendar. On May 2-3 the Western SD Open will be held in Rapid City, and the SD Team Championship will take place in Oacoma at the Cedar Shore Resort on June 13-14. (I've heard a rumor that an all-scholastic team will be participating there which hopes to create

problems for some of the adult teams participating!) Ralph Bailey's Luck of the Draw is scheduled for July 12--good practice for the SD Closed on July 25-26 in Pierre. Then it will be time for the Gambiteer's Open on August 29-30 at USD in Vermillion. Mark Derby and Steve Norquist have been organizing this event for months, and you won't want to miss it.

I just assume that you already have the Governor's Cup in your plans for September 11-13.

As you know, Tal Shaked, the World Junior Champion, will be our major star, but a dozen other grandmasters are being invited to join us also. A scholastic tournament will be held on that Saturday, September 12. We hope to double the number of scholastic players this year. All chess clubs outside Sioux Falls should plan to come to Sioux Falls early on September 11 and make arrangements with me in advance on having a grandmaster work with your students in a small setting such as one of the public libraries. I am still looking for more people to chauffeur a grandmaster to different schools/libraries on Friday September 11. Please let me know as soon as possible if you can volunteer to be a chauffeur.

The state scholastic tournament on March 28 was a wonderful success! I am certain that you will enjoy reading about this event elsewhere in this newsletter. Thanks again to Wes and Susan Schmidt, Terry and Jill Likens, and Steve Haataja for their many hours of hard work. Obviously, their efforts paid off since 136 students participated. Last year 80 students played in the same event.

Steve Cahill and Mark Knudson, both from Sioux Falls will participate in the National High School Chess Championship in Los Angeles in early May. This is the tournament that Sioux Falls will host in April of 1999. Two staff members of the Sioux Falls Convention Center will also attend this prestigious scholastic event to promote Sioux Falls. Their presence will greatly benefit all the efforts of the chess community in the state.

Jim Eckert of Estelline (873-2625) is making good progress with his chess club. He is in the process of inviting nine other schools in that area to either form their own club or join his.

If your club has any interest in playing chess in Estelline or helping him any fashion, please call immediately. Nine players from there participated in the state scholastic event at the end of March.

We wish David Likens the very best when he travels to Hawaii in early August to represent SD in the Arnold Denker Tournament of Champions. Likens, from Rapid City, finished first in the high school section of the scholastic tournament. We are proud to have you represent us!

David Kerkhove, who unfortunately beat my younger son in the Sioux Falls City Championship recently, will teach chess to employees of the Parks and Recreation Department here in Sioux Falls in late May. That department conducts summer programs at 28 different playgrounds throughout the city--more wonderful exposure for the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation.

Wes Schmidt continues to amaze all of us with the time he spends on promoting chess. The SD Chess Bulletin contains valuable information. Besides being the editor of the SD Chess Bulletin, Wes directs more of the tournaments in the state and is working with three school chess clubs: All City Elementary, Patrick Henry Middle School, and the Mark Twain after school chess program.

Last, I'd like to thank Jack Bier and Steve Haataja for their many hours of volunteer work with the students at Robert Frost Elementary School, Hayward Elementary School, Mark Twain Elementary School and Oscar Howe Elementary. In addition, Haataja has been working with home schoolers also. (Gateway is fortunate to have Steve Haataja back on their employee list, but I much preferred having him unemployed so that he could travel to chess clubs with me at all hours of the day!!)

Sioux Falls students will return to Madison on May 16 for a rematch. I'd have to confess that just the sound of Madison bothers me these days. They are getting tougher by the week.

It is really time for Sioux Falls students to get serious with those folks! I look forward to seeing you at a chess event in the near future. Please write or call me if you have any ideas on making chess in South Dakota more vibrant.

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TOURNAMENT REPORTS

DAKOTA OPEN

Sean Nagle, a 15-year old sophomore from Plymouth, Minn demonstrated remarkable poise under pressure as he racked up five wins and two draws for a 6-1 record in the first Dakota Open chess tournament held Saturday in Madison. By besting field, Nagle earned \$350.

His closest competitors, masters, Mike Sailer of Fargo and Leonard Johnson of Minneapolis, tied for second with records of 5.5-1.5. They each pocketed \$212.50.

Doug Hare of St. Paul and Lyle Hanson of Watertown tied for fourth, scoring 5-2 and winning \$112.50 each. Class prizes were awarded to Louis Horton of Sioux Falls(A), 4.5-2.5,Bruce Brandt of Brookings(B),4-3,Mark Derby of Vermillion(C),4.5-2.5,and Martin Waldner of Hartford(D),4-3.

The tournament a first for Madison attracted 58 players in three sections. Organizers were well pleased. The Reserve section, a four-round tournament limited to United States Chess Federation members who are rated under 1200(novice), was won by local chess enthusiast Tony Amert. He compiled a perfect 4-0 record to win an engraved chess clock. Matt Havlik of Madison tied for second place with David Knudson of Sioux Falls and Dan Merchant of Brookings. All had 3-1 records.

The Moms, Dads, and Duffers section, organized as a fund-raiser for the local Chess Club, drew 10 entrants. Several other people contributed, but preferred not to play. The participants played four games. Jim Eckert of Estelline won the trophy and a year's membership in the USCF.

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PROFILE OF SEAN NAGLE WINNER OF THE DAKOTA OPEN

Sean Nagle, 15-year-old sophomore at Robbindale Armstrong High School, has qualified for the 1998 All-American Chess Team. Of the more than 36,000 Youth and Scholastic members of U.S. chess, Sean is one of only 56 to be confirmed for this year's honors.

In February 1998, Sean achieved the title Chess Master, attaining a USCF rating of 2204. He is currently rated 2235 and ranked No.4 nationally among 15-year-olds.

Sean recently was invited to attend the American School of Chess in New York City this summer. The School is run by Edmar Mednis, International Chess Grandmaster, and is sponsored by Chess-in-the Schools. Each student is required to annotate one game from the '98 Karpov-Anand FIDE match as well as a selection of their own games from the previous 12 months. Objectives of the week-long school are "To start youngsters thinking as Grandmasters, to improve sporting and theoretical approach to tournament play, and to update and expand opening and other theoretical knowledge."

The St. Paul Winter Carnival Tournament, played the first weekend in February, was Sean's first tournament as a Master. He took first place in the Open section, the highlight being his third-round victory over International Master Victor Adler(2523).

The weekend of March 29-30, Sean posted a 6-0 record in winning the Minnesota High School Tournament. This qualifies him to play in the Arnold Denker Tournament of High School Champions to be held this coming August in Hawaii. The Denker Tournament runs parallel with the U.S.Open.

While attending Zachary Lane Elementary, Sean helped the chess team win State and National titles in 1991, '92 and '93. His Plymouth Middle School teams won the National K-8 Championship in '94 and '95.

In addition to his chess pursuits, Sean is maintaining a 4.0+ G.P.A. and playing tennis at Armstrong High School. Sean's current plans include representing Armstrong at the National High School Chess Tournament in Los Angeles, playing in the Chicago Open Tournament in May, and attending the American School of Chess in July and hopefully, playing in the U.S.Open

SIoux FALLS OPEN

The 14th Annual Revival of the Sioux Falls Open was held on April 18-19, 1998 at the Sioux Falls Labor Temple. Numbers were reduced from the last two years. Mike Sailer who won the last two years was unable to attend. This year's tournament marked the return of Mark Bohannon to South Dakota. Mark used to live in Vermillion, but now lives in Missouri. Until April he had a masters rating. Mark won the Sioux Falls Open this year winning a score of 4.5. He drew only with Steve Norquist and otherwise was not seriously tested. Bruce Draney of Omaha finished second losing only to Bohannon. Jack Bier of Sioux Falls, Steve Norquist of Vermillion and Daniel Schmidt of Rapid City tied for 1st A and 3rd Place with 3.5 points. Arman Goplen of North Dakota also finished with three and one-half points, won the B prize. Jerry Bergan of Watertown and Martin Waldner of Hartford tied for first C with three points. Dennis Amerine and David Bergan tied for first D with three points. Steve Cahill won the E prize with 2.5 points.

Five players from Estelline played in the Elementary Division and four players from the Sioux Falls Home School Association played in the Junior High Division. Our thanks to Barry Thompson and Flandreau Indian School for putting on such a nice tournament. For the first time in my memory every scholastic game had a clock on it. The appearance of the room with the sets fully set up prior to each game was awesome.

The only problem may be that the Flandreau Indian School Library was filled to the brim and if there are more persons next year they may need to find more space.

Michael Bergan won the High School title again beating his brother David in the last round. Madison beat Flandreau Indian School for the first time in this tournament in what may foreshadow the battle between these teams at the state tournament. Madison beat Flandreau Indian School 8.5-1.5 in head to head games. Madison players finished in five of the top six places.

John Bergan chose to play in junior high division instead of the elementary division when Justin Whitcomb could not play for the junior high team. Pierre Indian Learning Center probably wishes that Justin could have come. John tied for first place with Andrew Ellsworth of Madison. Both players had perfect scores, but John was awarded the trophy on tiebreak. Madison squeaked out a 12-11 win over Pierre Indian Learning Center. The Home School Association of Sioux Falls did well scoring nine points in their first appearance. Daniel Haggar of the Home School Association lost only to John Bergan in the last round.

Pierre Indian Learning Center dominated the Elementary Division. Their players finished in the top five places. Faron Cheyenne won the individual title with four points. One of the Estelline players finished with 2.5 points.

We would like to thank Don Haggar and the home school parents, Glenn Eide and the Pierre Indian Learning Center personnel, Jim Eckert of Estelline, Barry Thompson of Flandreau Indian School and Jud Bergan of Madison for their efforts in organizing teams and bringing them to the tournament without which the tournament would not have been possible.

MADISON WINS STATE SCHOLASTIC

Madison appeared to be a lock to prevent Flandreau Indian school from obtaining its fifth consecutive high school championship. However, the tournament came down to the game between Mark Knudson and Michael Bergan. If Knudson had won, Flandreau would have won the championship. Mark dropped his queen for a rook and Michael was able to convert the point and win the championship. The win also ties Mark and Michael at 3 wins apiece in the last year. David Likens beat Michael Bergan in the 3rd round and Ryan Daggitt in the fourth round to win the state scholastic championship. David will be South Dakota's representative at the Arnold Denker Tournament of High School Champions in Hawaii in August. TJ Likens took second including a draw with Mark Knudson where a mate in three was missed by TJ. Michael Bergan of Madison finished third. Ryan Daggitt and David Likens had tied for the junior high championship last year. Ryan Daggitt finished fourth with a win over David Bergan of Madison. Steve Cahill continued his improvement with a fifth place finish.

Madison also captured the junior high division edging Pierre Indian Learning Center by one point. Madison was led by Jonathan Stetler and Andrew Stetler who finished 1st- 2nd with perfect scores. Last year's champion Sioux Falls Patrick Henry had two players in the top five: Brandon Smith 3rd and Joe Waters 5th, but was unable to repeat. Pierre Indian Learning Center was led by Curtis Red Owl who finished fourth. Sioux Falls Home School Association finished in third place led by Daniel Haggar and John Shrader with three points apiece.

The Sioux Falls Home School Association won the elementary division with a perfect four points in the final round. Jordan and Isaac Gerdes of the Home School Association finished tied with favorite, John Bergan with four points. All hold the title South Dakota State Scholastic Elementary School Championship. Pierre Indian Learning Center finished one point back led by Flandreau champ, Faron Cheyenne and Duane Martin who finished fourth and fifth. Jordan Hislaw of Pierre Indian Learning Center and Nate Holman of Sioux Falls All City Elementary tied for the 3rd grade and below trophy. Madison also finished third in the elementary division.

A record 136 players played in the state scholastic including 66 in the elementary division and 19 players 3rd grade and below. This number was far above last years record of 79 which had doubled the previous record of 39. Hats off to Sam Ogdie and Sioux Falls O'Gorman which was able to accommodate the increased numbers. This year we had a skittles and game room manned by my wife, Susan Schmidt. The gym was open at times as an outlet to those players who wanted a more physical pursuit. The O'Gorman students also ran a snack bar. They addressed all of our concerns of a year ago and hope to be able to accommodate increased numbers next year.

Next year we plan to add a primary section. We may separate the high school division from the elementary division. We also will produce a guide for parents and coaches. Steve Haataja and Susan Schmidt were invaluable in processing registrations. Only the arrival of Flandreau Indian School Team at 9:00 am prevented the first round from starting on time. De Knudson and the Sioux Empire Chess Foundation provided money for trophies and mailings and also were source of most of the chess equipment. De has arranged for assistance with nearly every one of the Sioux Falls schools that attended. We hope to reach a total of 200 players for next years scholastic.

Pierre Indian Learning Center brought twenty-nine players. Sixteen players came from Madison. The Sioux Falls Home School Association sent twelve players.

.Nine players played for Estelline. Eight players from the Flandreau Indian School. Not counting the Home School Association which included non-Sioux Falls members, Sioux Falls had sixteen players in the high school section,, twelve in the junior high section and twenty-seven in the elementary section. Of the Sioux Falls schools in the high school section. Washington and O’Gorman had five players while Lincoln and Roosevelt had three and two players , respectively. Twelve Sioux Falls players were in the middle school division. Six from Patrick Henry, three from Edison, two from St. Mary’s and one from St. Joseph’s. Eight Sioux Falls elementary schools and the Childrens Home Society had teams in the Elementary Section: Hayward 8 John Harris 8. Childrens Home Society 4, All City Elementary 2, Horace Mann 2, Robert Frost 2, JFK 1, St.Lambert’s 1, St.Mary’s 1.

We must thank the coaches and parents who assisted in making the tournament a success. These players would not have come without the assistance of their organizers. I do not know all of the names of the parents, coaches and organizers who helped bring players to this event or encouraged them to come, but I will try to name a few I know. Jud Bergan, Madison;

Jim Eckert, Estelline; Barry Thompson, Flandreau Indian School; Glenn Eide and the staff of Pierre Indian Learning Center; Jeff Dexon and Michelle Loeske, John Harris: Don Haggar and Mark Gerdes of the Home School Association: Jack Bier and Steve Haataja who taught chess at Hayward and Robert Frost. David Kerkhove who taught chess at Edison John Wathier and Phyllis Schrag at Lincoln High. The person most responsible for our success is De Knudson who has sent chess sets and boards to most of these schools on behalf of Sioux Empire Chess Foundation, either supplied volunteer chess coaches for schools or went herself to most of the elementary schools listed and made sure that if at all possible every scholastic chess player either received a mailing about the State Scholastic or was handed a bulletin or newsletter which contained information about the tournament. I volunteered to run chess clubs at Patrick Henry Middle School and All City Elementary in Sioux Falls, but I was only there because De had made the effort to arrange for a club to meet and for me to be there.

The most improved teams were Madison that runs the most active chess club in this state and the Home School Association which has a chess class in the spring semester. Perhaps if you looking for improvement in your club you need look no further than these examples. Good luck and hope to see you at the State Junior Championship in July and at the Governors Cup Scholastic in September.
