NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL TOURNAMENT

APRIL 8-11,1999

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Another year is coming to a close. It is time to reassess where we are , where we have been and where we are going. This year has been one of the most successful in the history of South Dakota chess. Our list of USCF members is in excess of 350. This is nearly four times what it was only five years ago. We had the largest turnouts ever at the Teams, Scholastic and Governor's Cup. Jud Bergan ran two tournaments in which he gave out over \$1000.00. The National High School Chess Championship, a USCF national event will be held in Sioux Falls from April 8-11,1999. On the down side the number of SDCA members has not increased. We still continue to lose adult membership. The Pierre club is now down to six members. Despite all our efforts to increase participation at the Sioux Emprie Chess Club we still have had only one night when over 20 persons were present.(The GM Shaked simulataneous which was not announced). Ralph Bailey had moved

to Chamberlain and because of his new job will no longer be able to run chess tournaments in Sioux Falls. Jud Bergan has seen his membership decline at his chess club. Unlike previous years we have no upcoming tournaments in Brookings or Vermillion this winter or spring and Jud has warned that he cannot afford to lose large amounts of money guaranteeing prizes if the chess playing public will not support him. The Sioux Empire Chess Foundation has been informed that the South Dakota Tourism Department will no longer be involved in the Governor's Cup. The Tourism Department provided over \$5000.00 in mailings and payments to state representatives. We will have to determine what effect this will have on the future of the Governor's Cup. All of this should remind us that no matter our past success that we must keep working to broaden the base of South Dakota chess, so that the drop out of one or two persons does not bring down the current level of South Dakota chess.. We need to work hard to expand the number of schools at the scholastic so that the dropout of one school does not lower the number of participants. We need to let more people be in charge of South Dakota chess, so that they feel that they have a vested interest in what goes on with South Dakota. If anyone has any suggestions, let me know WDS

PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

[Ed.Note-The SDCA President, De Knudson recently had an article published in USCF's School Mates magazine in the "Parent's Corner" section] **1999 National H.S. Championship" by De Knudson, Chief Organizer.** Chess began at our house seven year's ago. My mother-in-law gave my younger son Mark, a fairly dilapidated cardboard chessboard and plastic pieces. She was leaving the house she had lived in for 35 years and had found them in a closet, as she packed for her move. My husband, Dave, knew a little chess set but not much, and I knew nothing about the game. Nevertheless, Mark was interested in learning the game so his father shared a few things with him. I grabbed an encyclopedia and read the chess article several times before making a card for Mark that showed exactly how each piece moved. Within a few months a good friend of ours. Reuben Bezpaletx, told us about the weekly chess club in Sioux Falls, South Dakota where we reside. We started attending the chess club on a regular basis and were treated kindly by everyone. Six year's later, we have chess friends from all over the country and our lives have been enriched tremendously. In the spring of 1993, we decided that "we" were ready for a national scholastic tournament. Mark and I still smile about our first tournament in Charlotte, N.C., I had no idea how to read pairing charts or cross tables and was amazed to see so many children playing chess at one time. I called home regularly with my amazing tales and read Searching for Bobby Fischer all weekends thinking that I would learn how to "do" these events. Since Mark loved bughouse and had no partner, I knew that I would have to be resourceful. Somehow I managed to find a father and son, Dick and Michael Mosher, from Clive Iowa, who were thinking along the same lines. Mark and Michael teamed up for bughouse that day and became good friends. My husband and I alternate taking Mark to national tournaments. I can't imagine how empty our lives would have been without chess. By the end of 1993, it was my turn to escort Mark to the National Scholastic K-12 Championship in St. Louis, Missouri. As we were leaving the St. Louis airport in pouring rain for the tournament headquarters, I befriended Shoo Saegusa and her son, Kaz, one year behind Mark in school, but a fabulous chess player. We shared a taxi and became fast friends. After attending two or three national chess tournaments, I told my husband that I knew Sioux Falls could host one. Sioux Falls is a friendly city of approximately 114,000 people in the southeastern part of the state. When he doubted me, I reminded him that Sioux Falls was a great central location for chess players from around the country. I am extremely proud to announce that Sioux Falls has been chosen as the site of 1999 National High School Championship, and I will be chief organizer of the event. Those dates are April 9-11, 1999. And then there is the Governor's Cup story. On December 31, 1995, I wrote a letter to South Dakota Governor Bill Janklow. I told him that I thought a chess tournament would be a great tourism event for our state. Fortunately, Governor Janklow agreed with me, and Sioux Falls has now hosted three successful Governor's Cup tournaments. During the last three years many strong grandmasters participated in our tournament. Furthermore, we persuaded the most prestigious chief arbiter in the nation, Carol Jarecki, to be our tournament director. We hope to see all of them and all of you at the next Governor's Cup tournament which will be held in the Fall of 1999. We look forward to hosting the 1999 National High School Championship and hope that all of you are making plans to attend. 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CURT BRASKET AND THE CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS TOURNAMENT

FM Curt Brasket of Minnesota played in this year's Governor's Cup.Brasket also attended the 1st Governor's Cup in 1996 finishing in the top 10.John Donaldson writes in INSIDE CHESS that "[o]ne of the sentimental favorites at the Governor's Cup was the 65-year-old Minnesota Master Curt Brasket. During the 1950's and 60's Brasket was one of the top players in the country but lacked opportunities due to his geographical isolation. He did tie for first with Hans Berliner in the 1957 USCF Tournament of Champions in Yankton, South Dakota. Forty years later Curt was back in South Dakota and playing on one of top boards in round four before being turned back by GM Tal Shaked." The Champion of Champions Tournament was held from August 31-September 2,1957 at the Hotel Charles Gurney in Yankton, South Dakota. It was directed by Yankton resident IM George Koltanowski.and sponsored by the United States Chess Federation The winner was invited to the U.S.Championship. Nineteen state champions attended.At the same time thirty-four players participated in a Morphy Centennial Tournament in Yankton. Brasket tied with Berliner for 1st place,but lost the title on tiebreak.

Brasket also drew with Jack Shaw who actually had him beat after Brasket missed a winning line.on move 24. In a footnote about theBrasket-Berliner game written 9-18-98,Brasket writes." In previous meetings, we had split victories-I won in the 1953 US Open,Hans in the 1955 Eastern Open. In this, our third meeting, I entered the ending with an exchange up, plus a significant time advantage on the clock! But then I forgot to punch my clock, nearly forfeiting on time, and blundered back the exchnage. This eventually cost me the title and an invitation to the US Championship,although I still tied for the Champions title" FM Brasket provided De Knudson with copies of the September 20,1957 edition of Chess Life then a biweekly newspaper and handwritten copies of his games. The notes and annotations are his except for the brief notes by Santasiere.Our thanks to FM Brasket for providing this glimpse into South Dakota's chess history.

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Johnson Wins Dakota Open II

Report by Jud Bergan

Leonard Johnson of Minneapolis, MN, made a convincing demonstration of his senior master status, buzzing through the field of 23 chess enthusiasts at the second Dakota Open, held here in Madison at the DSU Trojan Center. He finished first with a near perfect record, winning six games and drawing one for a 6 1/2-1/2 result. His only draw came in round four with 16-year-old master, Sean Nagle of Plymouth, MN, who won the first Dakota Open last March. Nagle earned second place and \$275 in prize money with five wins and two draws for a 6 - 1 record. Although Xiao Yu of Madison gained a knight advantage against the champ in round six, Johnson rose to the occasion and finagled the victory through a clever combination, breaking a pawn loose which he cashed for a queen to seal the win. 1st prize was \$350. There was a four way tie for 3rd - 6th place, as Douglas Hare of St. Paul, Mike Sailer of Fargo, 15-year-old Mark Knudson of Sioux Falls, and Tim Paintner of Vermillion each won \$112.50 in prize money with 4 1/2 - 2 1/2 records. Arlo Mann of Watertown (4 - 3) won the Class B prize of \$57.25, while 12-year-old John and 18-year-old Dave Bergan of Madison split the \$75 Class D prize fund with 3 1/2 - 3 1/2 records. In the Reserve Section (USCF ratings under 1200) 10-year-old Isaac Gerdes of Renner and Joe Bergan of St. Cloud, MN, tied after four rounds with 3 - 1 records. Gerdes won the speed chess playoff to earn an engraved chess clock as first prize. Greg Waters, won the Moms Dads and Duffers section and a year's free membership in the US Chess Federation. The talented youth of the area are making their presence felt, as no less than five people under age 20 earned prizes. The players also spoke very highly of the playing site and facilities. 1998 SIOUX FALLS CITY SCHOLASTIC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Sioux Falls City Scholastic Championships were held on November 14,1998 at O’Gorman High School. The numbers increased from 35 to 53. Newcomers included 14 players from the Sioux Falls Home School Association,8 players from Mark Twain and 4 players from St.Lamberts.The one disappointment was John Harris which only entered 2 players after 8 players last year.Mark Knudson easily won the K-12 Division again and led his Washington High team to second title over O’Gorman 10.5-8.Ryan Daggitt of Roosevelt finished second at 3.5.John Shrader of the Home School Association was able to draw Ryan Daggitt in the last round and took 3rd on tiebreak over Matt Jordahl and Brian Samson both of O’Gorman. Ilia Nossov of Edison dominated the K-9 Divsion again winning 5-0.Anthony Vicino of O’Gorman recovered from his loss to Joe Waters in Round 3 to finish second on tiebreak over Brandon Smith of Lincoln High who was awarded 3rd place over Dustin Krell of Edison. The Home School Association tied with Edison for the team title,but was awarded the title on tiebreak. Notable upsets included. Jenna Haggar over Dustin Krell and Matt Hardy over Daniel Haggar in round 1. Unfortunately,Jenna and Matt did not win again they played each other in the last round.Brandon Smith won his last round game over Joe Waters despite dropping his Queen to a touch move. With his brother,Isaac in the K-9 division,Jordan Gerdes was able to dominate the K-6 division. Ba Nguyen of Longfellow finished second losing only to Jordan. Jonathan Magera of Patrick Henry took third on tiebreak over Michael Elson who had taken a half point bye in round 3.Magera was a whole queen down to Brant Abeln of Mark Twain,but was stalemated. This may have cost Abeln and Mark Twain a trophy. St.Lambert’s won the team trophy by one-half point over Mark Twain. Sam Waters of Mark Twain won the K-3 tournament with a perfect score. Nate Holman of ACE took second losing only to Sam.Andrew Glader of Home School took third and may be the suprise of the tournament.The Sioux Falls Home School Association took the team trophy 8-7 over Mark Twain.

Overall the tournament went well. David Bergan assisted me with the tournament. My thanks to Sam Ogdie of O’Gorman. Without his help this tournament would not have been possible. He obtained the site ,set up and pulled down tables. They also sold lunches which was good since we were experimenting with five rounds to avoid ties for first. They were a few incidents including two touch moves upon which rulings had to made. Several players were under the illusion that when the 60th move was made that the game was a draw, also illegal moves created situation where the players had to reconstruct games. This was much stronger tournament than last year and reflects the keen competition among the higher rated players and the ability of persons like Greg Waters, Mark Gerdes and Don Haggar to obtain the participation of more players. We also would like to thank De Knudson and Sioux Empire Chess Foundation which mailed copies of these fliers to the Governor’s Cup Scholastic participants and distributed the fliers to all Sioux Falls schools with which we currently have contact.

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Sioux Falls Sweeps Madison

In the fifth interscholastic chess match between Madison and the combined Sioux Falls schools, Sioux Falls proved to be too much for the Madison team as they swept all three divisions - elementary, junior high and senior high. It was the first time Sioux Falls has won all three categories, and the first time Sioux Falls has won the senior high division since their first encounter. Madison won all three divisions in August 1997. Madison, the reigning state junior high and senior high

champs, had to play one board short in the junior high section as one of their players had to withdraw at the last minute and a replacement could not be found. It was decided to play Mike Bergan (still considered a ninth grader until he starts school this fall) in the junior high section for the first round. Under U.S. Chess Federation rules, if a team is a player short, the team must take a loss in that game for each of the four rounds of the match. There are four players on each team in each of the three divisions. The strategy appeared to be working as Bergan, Justin Whitcomb and Gordon Kent each won their games in the first round, while Dustin Krell of S.F. defeated Justin Van Ormer to give Madison a 3-1 lead. Kent, a newcomer to the team, was the hero of the hour as he defeated top S. F. board, Ilia Nossov, who ran out of time just seconds before Kent did. The games must be completed before either player uses up 45 minutes on his chess clock.

The elementary teams split the first round, with John Bergan and Jeremiah Johnson winning for Madison, while Jenna Haggar and Kyle Cottrill garnered victories for S. F. The Madison Sr. High team, however, could manage only one first round victory as Xiao Yu, who recently moved to Madison from Mississippi, defeated Daniel Haggar. Mark Knudson and Steve Cahill of Sioux Falls beat Matt Havlik and Dave Bergan of Madison, while Ryan Daggitt of S.F. won by forfeit. Trailing 3-1, the Sr. High team could no longer afford to lend Mike Bergan to the Jr. High team, so for the rest of the tournament he stayed with the seniors. The roof fell in for the Jr. High team starting in round 2. Krell, Nossov, Joe Waters and Anthony Vicino of Sioux Falls won all of their remaining games, bull dozing the match 12-3. Krell was the medalist with a perfect 4-0 record. Things weren't much better in the elementary section, as S. F.'s Jenna Haggar sacrificed her queen in a brilliant four move combination to mate John Bergan, Madison's top elementary board. She went on to become the medalist with an unblemished 4-0 record. The final score was 10.5 - 4.5 for S.F., as Haggar, Cottrill (2.5 - 1.5) and Sam Waters (3-1) rolled up the score. Hoping to rectify the first round deficit by fielding a full team, Madison's Sr. High section was brought up short by the much improved Sioux Falls bunch. Although Xiao Yu of Madison was the medalist with a 3.5 - .5 record, both Steve Cahill and South Dakota State Junior Champ, Mark Knudson, went 3-1 for the winners, giving a final 9-7 margin of victory. Yu is the current Mississippi State Scholastic Champion.
